For many years the Diocese of Green Bay has provided financial support and priests to staff two parishes in the Dominican Republic, St. Teresa Parish in Elias Pina and St. Isidore Parish in El Llano. These parishes are located in the poverty stricken western part of the Dominican Republic, right on the border of Haiti.

Grade School and Vocational High School

In the fall of 2005 under the direction of Fr. Mike Seis, our Dominican Republic mission opened a grade school. Since that time they have added a vocational high school and currently have over 800 students enrolled. Their greatest need at this time is financing to run the school.



Chapel repairs

The two parishes in the Dominican Republic mission consist of over 90 communities and many of these have chapels. Fr. Mike writes that some of these chapels are in need of repairs. Donations for <u>Chapel repairs</u> would be used to buy cement, lumber, paint, etc.

Fr. Joseph Giordano, CICM Ministry: Missionhurst Erdnet, Mongolia

My Home Kindergarten – For the Little Ones of Erdnet, Mongolia

Mongolia – A distant and strange land on the other side of the world filled with stories of nomadic people living off a rugged land. The harsh reality is that millions of people have migrated to the larger cities over the past five years to escape the devastation of several years of drought and harsh winters. Arriving with only their possessions, families scrounge for any space to set up their ger (the traditional Mongolian white felt tent) and thus begin their new life amidst the slums. Children are the most vulnerable being neglected by their parents who search daily for food, fuel, and drinkable water. Very often they are left orphaned to wander the streets to beg for food.

In 1992, Missionhurst CICM (Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary) missionaries answered the call from Pope John Paul II to reestablish the Catholic Church in this forgotten land. Seeking to alleviate the physical suffering of the people, Missionhurst established a second mission in the slum areas of the overcrowded city of Erdnet. My Home Kindergarten was founded by Missionhurst Fathers in 2002, and provides food and shelter during the day for the five and six year olds, while preparing them for their entry into primary school by teaching them their alphabet, colors, and how to write with a pencil. Perhaps of most significance is that these children have a place to feel safe, warm and loved, and experience what it is like to simply be a child.



Needs of My Home Kindergarten

- A contribution of \$107.14 can buy an entire year's meat supply for one child.
- 2) Likewise, \$14.28 can buy a year's supply of milk, \$35.71 for flour, and \$38.09 for rice.
- 3) \$5.00 will purchase a pair of boots, and a winter coat for one child.
- A contribution of any size will make a difference to the lives of these children.

Pictured above is Fr. Emmanuel Dumbi, current Director overseeing My Home Kindergarten. Fr. Emmanuel told us that due to the hard life of these people, he witnessed hunger, neglect, malnutrition, and abuse when he visited each child's home. It is vital to continue providing a "home" away from home for these children.

"To see the smile on one child's face that holds a spoon for the first time to eat from a bowl of warm soup, is to see that same smile on God's face," - says Fr. Gabriel Tshimanga, founder of My Home Kindergarten, of his work with these little ones.

Help the Students at the Kavule Nursery School - Purchase a Uniform or a month's worth of Porridge –

Sponsor: Sr. Mary Goretti Nassuuna, Asst. Regional Superior Little Sisters of St. Francis, Kampala, UGANDA

The Kavule Nursery School was started in January, 2011 under the direction of the Congregation of the Little Sisters of St. Francis of the Kampala Province, Uganda. The school is located deep in the remote village of Kavule near the shores of Lake Victoria. Due to its location, services such as education, medical attention and catechism are very poor and so are the people.

Objective of the Kavule School Project:

To enable the children of the Kavule area/village to have access to a better education and to ensure future responsible citizens.

Challenges:

1. One of the main challenges encountered by the school is the lack of funds to provide uniforms for the pupils which their parents cannot afford.



2. The second challenge is the need to provide a simple porridge meal for the pupils. Most leave their homes very early without breakfast because there is none. The children are better able to concentrate when they have eaten.

How can you help??

- The cost for one Uniform is \$10.00 the school has approximately100 students (Total cost for 100 students is \$1,000)
- Maize Flour for porridge for 100 pupils is \$182/month OR \$2,184/year

The major problem facing the women of the Bukulula Parish, a part of the Masaka Diocese, Uganda, is an inadequate source of income to support their families in a rural environment.

<u>Pig Project</u>

Sponsor: Rev. Charles Ssekyewa Bukulula Parish

The <u>Pig Project</u> is intended to empower these women with a sow pig (female pig), so they can earn a living and be able to send their children to school, obtain manure for their banana crops & vegetable gardens, and improve their diets. With the help of this project, they can alleviate the cycle of poverty they and their families have come to know.



The project would start with 45 women, three from every subparish (the Parish has 15 subparishes). Each woman would receive a sow, a shelter with a cement floor, and a built up pit to hold the animal waste as fertilizer.

In U.S. Dollars, the cost of one pig with shelter and pit is: \$72.00

Each of the 45 women receiving sows would be required to pass a piglet on to another woman until the project circulates the whole Parish

Assistance Needed to Purchase Sewing Machines

Sponsor: Rev. Anthony Boothali Director – PEACE

Pastoral Evangelization and Children Education (PEACE) was started in the year 1998 for the purpose of providing education to the poor children in the Chittoor District of India.



PEACE also undertakes non-formal educational programs for school drop outs, both girls and boys. One non-formal educational program PEACE provides for the girls and women is called SEWING AND TAILORING.

Object of the Program:

The ratio of school drop outs is higher for girls than boys in this area. So the program for *Sewing and Tailoring* was initiated as a way to help these girls support themselves. The one year training program has room for 50 girls and women. During the course of the program, the girls are taught sewing, netting, embroidery and needlework by a qualified staff.

Benefits: Upon completion of the training program, the girls are provided a sewing machine and tailoring certificate. With this they are able to establish their own sewing shop and make clothes for people to buy. This helps the girls to earn their livelihood and support their families. The sewing center also makes greetings cards and embroidery items like napkins and tablecloths to sell. Some of the girls are employed here.

<u>Assistance Needed:</u> Financial assistance is required to purchase sewing machines and supply to the girls after they complete the training.

The cost of one sewing machine is \$75.00

PROJECT UPLIFT

Offering Shelter and a free Education to street children

Brothers of the Sacred Heart, Kampala, Uganda

Founded in 2003 by a Brother of the Sacred Heart, *Project Uplift* especially targets teenage boys and girls who for various reasons have no one to care for them and are unable to obtain an education. Currently in Kampala, Uganda, there are hundreds of youngsters living on the streets. Some of the older street kids are also responsible for the care of younger siblings. How did this tragic situation come about? Some youngsters lost parents to AIDS and have no one else to care for them. Others come from war ravaged northern Uganda where the infamous "Lord's Resistance Army" has for years killed and terrorized villagers and kidnapped children for the purpose of using them as soldiers. Whether because they were orphaned or because they feared being brutalized by the marauding Lord's Resistance army these children fled to Kampala, a city of well over a million inhabitants. Unfortunately, like many other children who live on the streets and depend on handouts, these youngsters are often physically, emotionally and sexually victimized.

Initially *Project Uplift* was organized to keep these youngsters busy and off the streets. Within a short time an educational component was put in place. Currently three Brothers of the Sacred Heart and a number of Ugandan lay men and women volunteer to staff the program. The education offered by these dedicated adults has made it possible for the youngsters in their care to obtain a high school certificate. Several who completed the *Project Uplift* educational program are now attending university, a tribute to the quality of education they received. In gratitude for the opportunities this project has offered them, those attending university often return to *Project Uplift* to assist the staff. In 2003 about 6 boys and girls were involved in this program. Now 65 teenagers benefit from *Project Uplift*. A small school block and dormitory have recently been built. Besides a free education *Project Uplift* teaches self sufficiency. The preparation of the meals, the cleaning of the buildings, the gardening and care of small domestic animals are all done by the youngsters themselves. This also helps to hold down the cost of the program.

HOW CAN YOU HELP? *Project Uplift* provides food, clothing, health care and an education to all youngsters in its care. Many of these young people are also given shelter while others live with relatives or with families open to receiving them. It costs \$450 annually to support and educate one boy or girl. That translates to about \$1.25 daily. You can also contribute to a fund that eventually will help finance the expansion of the current facilities.

Project Needs in the Kasana-Luweero Diocese, Uganda

Sponsor: Fr. Celestine Byekwaso Home Diocese of Kasana-Luweero

<u>Project 1:</u> Help to Build a Classroom

Fr. Celestine Byekwaso is a priest from the Kasana-Luweero Diocese in Uganda. He is currently serving the needs of his diocese (raising financial assistance) while serving as Administrator of St. Anne Parish in Coleman/Lena. He writes:

In a parish that has several schools, some of the children attend classes under trees because of the lack of buildings. In my home village the



elementary school, that has over four hundred students, offers most of the lessons under trees in the compound. This means that during the rainy season the children cannot attend classes. Whenever it rains, all of them have to run into the three classrooms and a staff-room for shelter. I've included pictures of the school on a bright day when students are attending class under a tree.

The school needs another four rooms to make a total of seven classrooms. No contribution is too small towards the education of these young African children.



<u>Project 2:</u> Water is Life: Help us to get Water in this School

Unlike the schools in the USA, most of the schools in the Diocese of Kasana-Luweero have no running water on the campus. Some even have no drinking water near the compound. More than ten of our schools fall into this category.

A recent survey found that there is a lot of water underground in the compound. Each school needs to raise \$10,000 in order to have water on the campus.

No contribution is too small; with some help we can have fresh water for our students and people in the villages

Project 3: Help Purchase Vestments/Chasubles

The Kasana-Luweero Diocese is the youngest diocese in Uganda and is still establishing itself in many areas. Fr. Celestine likes to concentrate on celebrating a simple, good and colorful liturgy. For this purpose, he would like to purchase a set of one hundred vestments (made of the same material, color and style) to be used at the diocesan celebrations. The cost of a vestment, if purchased in Uganda, runs about \$200.00. No donation is too small for this need.

Sister Vincenta Lopez Lopez is the General Administrator for the Tepeyac Institute in Leon Moderno, Mexico. Sr. Vincenta writes: *"The school holds 900 students, from preschool to pre-college, and is open to the poorest who often can't pay the tuition."*

The area is now in a deep recession. The costs of tuition, uniforms and school supplies are a great strain on single parent households and the many households struggling with unemployment. In order for Tepeyac Institute to remain open, it needs to meet government operating standards, enrollment levels need to be maintained. If the school were to close, the educational needs of this area would suffer greatly. The majority of the students would be forced to drop out of school entirely. Without an education, the future remains dark for these young people.

Can you help with some of the financial needs of our students & school as listed below.

- 4 At the primary level, a uniform & school supplies for one year costs \$337.00
- 4 At the high school level, a uniform & school supplies for one year costs \$400.00

Project: Refugee Women Literacy and Vocational Training Sacred Heart Church, Cairo –Egypt

Sacred Heart Church is a Roman Catholic Church belonging to the Latin Catholic Vicariate of Egypt. It is situated in a popular area of the Abbasiya district in Cairo. It has served the refugee and displaced Southern Sudanese community living in Cairo since 1984. There are about 40,000 refugees and displaced people from Southern Sudan living in Cairo-Egypt. The majority of these people depend on Sacred Heart Church for their spiritual, social, and humanitarian needs.

Sacred Heart started implementing the Refugee Women Literacy and Vocation Training project six years ago, in order to help women who are the most vulnerable group of people in the refugee population. As most women have to care for their children, the parish started the vocational training project to help women depend on themselves and at the same time have some time to dedicate to their families.

Funding Request: Sacred Heart Church relies on donors and well wishers in order to continue with this program. The main costs of the project are teachers' salaries, materials used in training, maintenance of the equipment, and the sewing machines, and also the administrative costs. We are in urgent need of funding so as to continue with this project. The overall cost for running this project for one year is \$5,000.



Aims of Sacred Heart Church

- To ensure the spiritual growth of its members.
- To create a welcoming environment for the Sudanese refugees and displaced community.
- To help preserve the Sudanese cultural heritage.
- To provide material assistance to those in the greatest need.
- To provide educational and vocational training to refugee and displaced Sudanese children, youth, and adults.
- To empower the community through training, involvement in decision making, and community participation in all activities of the church.

PROJECT: Financial Assistance for the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse

For over 30 years Brother Regis and volunteers of the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse in New Holstein, Wisconsin have been sending pallets of food, vitamins, medicines, clothing, soap and other materials to missions in countries around the world.

Daily, items arrive at the New Holstein warehouse to be shipped around the world to mission villages. Brother Regis along with 290 unpaid volunteers (average age being 75), spend thousands of hours sorting and packing the items for shipment. Between January 1996 and June 1997 alone, the warehouse shipped more than 17 million pounds of donated food, clothing, and medicines.

PROJECT: Help the Poor in Nicaragua

Dear Friends ~ people of God,

May the Lord give you His Peace!

Our main small/big projects in the Nicaraguan mission encompass four parishes, which a diocesan priest and this Capuchin Franciscan constantly attend to via a truck, on foot, or by horseback.

Each town parish has an average of 20 outside smaller village farm communities to attend to, perhaps 40,000 people and no state highway for traveling. In an average day I offer four Masses, besides sick calls, funerals, studies in gospel formation for youth, children, adults. The laity participation is dynamic and extensive; for example, marriage preparation, visits to the sick and prisoners, liturgy preparation and participation, youth & adult retreats, and peace & justice commissions. This is the big part of the mission outlook.

The little projects appear each day, as in the life of St. Francis and St. Theresa of Calcutta. This is where your prayers and small/big financial help is a blessing.

<u>Right now our needs are as follows:</u>

- A plate of food for the hungry that come to our door and others we must feed during the retreats and religious studies. We also take food & clothing to the poorest of the poor as we become aware of their situation. At times we find the kitchen bare and not even a fire burning.
- ✤ <u>A gallon or two of gasoline</u> for our 1998 truck to take us to the end of the road, before walking or riding a horse to the bush, or riverside community.
- ✤ A milk cow, so we can have milk and cheese for our home community of 3 Capuchin missioners, 5 youth students, one missioner, and for the pilgrim visitors. Cost: \$150.
- ★ <u>\$7.00</u> helps a student for a month of study materials.
- A single hall for our study groups, who often use the facility from Friday to Sunday. This dream hasn't become a reality in 4 years. The same hall serves as a sleeping area for which we need to add a simple kitchen and bathroom facility.
