Ad Gentes Jankasa Project

Truth be told, you can be part of a missionary project even from your own home!

Moved by the sight of village children who have not seen the four walls of formal classroom and ravaged by poverty, illiteracy and poor environmental sanitation; Ad Gentes Missionaries embarked upon the task of opening an elementary school in addition to our adult Literacy Program serving the remote villages of Jankasa and others on the bank of the Shiroro river of north central Nigeria. We started with 15 children and today have 155 pupils, 46 women and 11 men in our Adult Literacy Center. We provide free and quality education. We are in need of assistance to build more classrooms, latrines, provide a library, desks, chairs and recreational playground equipment.

Everyday new kids with their parents knock on our door begging on bended knees to be admitted. Will you be their hope?

There is great need for educational assistance for young teenage mothers, school dropouts and street kids. Many unwed teenage mothers are abandoned by their families when they get pregnant. Can you purchase an oxen (\$200.00 U.S. each) for a family living in destitution in Zambia?

Zambia is ranked among the poorest nations of the world. Eighty percent of Zambians live in abject poverty, on a diet of less than a dollar a day. The HIV/AIDS pandemic makes the situation worse. Every family is affected by this pandemic either because of orphans they have adopted, are headed by a single parent, or are a double-orphaned child-headed home.

At Minga parish, we identify such vulnerable families and purchase a pair of oxen and a plough which set them up in life. With oxen they are able to;

- plough the field and produce enough food for consumption and to sell
- transport their crops from the field to the villages
- plough other people's fields and make money
- transport the sick and the dead between the village and hospital
- provide manure fertilizer for their crops
- And within three years they are able to buy a cow and raise their own head of cattle which has added advantages.

PROJECT UPLIFT

Offering Shelter and a free Education to street children

Brothers of the Sacred Heart, Kampala, Uganda

Founded in 2003 by a Brother of the Sacred Heart, *Project Uplift* especially targets teenage boys and girls who for various reasons have no one to care for them and are unable to obtain an education. Currently in Kampala, Uganda, there are hundreds of youngsters living on the streets. Some of the older street kids are also responsible for the care of younger siblings. How did this tragic situation come about? Some youngsters lost parents to AIDS and have no one else to care for them. Others come from war ravaged northern Uganda where the infamous "Lord's Resistance Army" has for years killed and terrorized villagers and kidnapped children for the purpose of using them as soldiers. Whether because they were orphaned or because they feared being brutalized by the marauding Lord's Resistance army these children fled to Kampala, a city of well over a million inhabitants. Unfortunately, like many other children who live on the streets and depend on handouts, these youngsters are often physically, emotionally and sexually victimized.

Initially *Project Uplift* was organized to keep these youngsters busy and off the streets. Within a short time an educational component was put in place. Currently three Brothers of the Sacred Heart and a number of Ugandan lay men and women volunteer to staff the program. The education offered by these dedicated adults has made it possible for the youngsters in their care to obtain a high school certificate. Several who completed the *Project Uplift* educational program are now attending university, a tribute to the quality of education they received. In gratitude for the opportunities this project has offered them, those attending university often return to *Project Uplift* to assist the staff. In 2003 about 6 boys and girls were involved in this program. Now 65 teenagers benefit from *Project Uplift*. A small school block and dormitory have recently been built. Besides a free education *Project Uplift* to assist the subject to be project the project to be built.

Uplift teaches self sufficiency. The preparation of the meals, the cleaning of the buildings, the gardening and care of small domestic animals are all done by the youngsters themselves. This also helps to hold down the cost of the program.

HOW CAN YOU HELP? Project Uplift provides food, clothing, health care and an education to all youngsters in its care. Many of these young people are also given shelter while others live with relatives or with families open to receiving them. It costs \$450 annually to support and educate one boy or girl. That translates to about \$1.25 daily. You can also contribute to a fund that eventually will help finance the expansion of the current facilities.

Assistance for Orphans at St. Lawrence Orphanage, In Zambia: Double Orphans Picked From the Streets of Lusaka and Given a Second Chance in Life

The Theresian sisters of Zambia run St. Lawrence orphanage. The sisters care for orphaned children aged between eight and eighteen years. These children are street kids picked from the streets of Lusaka city. Due to HIV/AIDS, there are many families that are either single or double orphaned. Many kids run away from poverty at home or the responsibility of being head of the household. They turn to the streets of Lusaka to beg, do piece works, steal from the innocent people and engage in child prostitution for girls. Given a chance, these kids turn into criminals.

At St. Lawrence orphanage, the sisters give these kids a second chance. We provide them with shelter, food and free education. We have converted two cargo containers into dormitories and built one more dormitory that provides shelter to these kids. We have women and men that cook and provide a foster home for them.

Feeding the Hungry:

- Monthly gift of \$250 provides soup bowls to feed 1500-2000 people

For 12 years Friends of Haiti has sent semi-annual medical and surgical missions, development and education planners to the barren mountains and valleys of the four sections of Thomzaeau in Haiti. By partnering with the people there, the goal is to give them a hand in making their own lives better.

Although ongoing general help is central to our mission, a special request this year is for funds to provide surgeries. A patient and caregiver need to travel away from home, often long distances on foot, to a hospital. By April this year a list of 20 requests had already come in from one area pastor. Costs ranged from \$50 to \$200 with one running \$300 for a mass on a leg. A recent procedure saved the life of a 7 year old with a hole in his intestines that was probably caused by worms. He is the 7th child in a family that has seen the other six perish.

A healthy population is able to work with and through the help that is offered. Friends of Haiti is committed to:

- Improving education
- Lessening the ongoing threat of cholera by helping to provide clean water
- Teaching about disease prevention
- Agricultural and development work through tree nurseries, gardens, and small animal husbandry

So many opportunities for long term improvement exist, but a healthy population is critical to its success.

Zambia, officially the Republic of Zambia, is a landlocked country in Southern Africa. The neighboring countries are the Democratic Republic of Congo to the north, Tanzania to the north-east, Malawi to the east, Mozambique, Zimbabwe, Botswana and Namibia to the south and Angola to the west. The capital city is Lusaka.

In 1976, as a result of the General Chapter of 1974, Missionhurst—CICM (Congregation of the Immaculate Heart of Mary) opened a new mission station in Zambia, particularly, in the Diocese of Ndola in the mining area. The country produces mainly copper.


Since its arrival in 1976, Missionhurst-CICM is involved in the formation of small Christian communities, formation of lay people and the promotion of the welfare of people.

St. Monica Parish in Lusaka, with a population of 5,000, is one of the parishes where our Missionhurst-CICM are working. Fr. Maurice Galasa, a native of the Philippines, has been working in

this parish for almost 5 years. He is involved not only in the spiritual and sacramental needs but also in the material needs of people.

Fr. Maurice started a poultry program to raise and grow chickens as a source of income and food. Due to sickness, carried by contaminated water, Fr. Maurice is building a borehole to provide

the community with clean and potable water. He is also building an overhead water tank to store clean water for their daily use.

The Hogar Maria Auxiliadora (The Home of the Helping Mother)

This is a Bolivian Orphanage Project which cares for small children and young girls who are abandoned for a variety of reasons including: the death of the parents, extreme poverty in rural areas, families hurt by alcoholism, and sadly, in some cases, physical abuse.

Thankfully the Daughters of the Divine Savior... with your help... Rescue these children and give them the loving care and hope they need to turn their lives around. The Orphanage project is located in Itocta, a small rural village, located 30 minutes south of Cochabamba, Bolivia. The Sisters are struggling with the rapid rise in the cost of food and other basic necessities. A local Catholic couple visits the Hogar twice a year to ascertain needs & share sponsor smiles!

- To establish an <u>emergency dental care program</u> They have <u>no</u> regular dental care now \$20 can prevent a tooth from being pulled and save it instead \$35 can provide a dental cleaning and care for one child for 1 year.
- To <u>improve the quality of their diet</u> (meat and vegetables are very expensive)
 \$27 can provide a healthier diet for just one child for an entire year
 \$53 can provide a healthier diet for 54 girls for 1 week (\$0.14/child/day)
- To provide Caring Love... Priceless! (this improves self esteem) Take time to write a letter to just one girl - sign it with love!

Help Build a School Structure

Sponsored by: Little Sisters of St. Francis. Kampala. UGANDA

The St. Gyavira Primary School (formerly the Kavule Nursery School) was started in January, 2011 under the direction of the Congregation of the Little Sisters of St. Francis of the Kampala Province, Uganda. The school is located deep in the remote village of Kavule near the shores of Lake Victoria. Due to its location, services such as education, medical attention and catechism are very poor. The children have not had the opportunity of going to school because their parents don't have money for education.

Help Construct a School Building

The Little Sisters of St. Francis have paved the way to begin this school but the work is still at its birth. Great help is needed to put up a school structure.

Among the children, some are total orphans whose parents died of HIV. Looking at the situation in this village, there is a great need for a school building where these children can have an education.



Currently, the children of St. Gyavira Primary School are taught under the trees. During the rainy season classes cannot be held.

How can you help??

From start to finish, the cost of building a school for these children in U.S. dollars would be \$20,000.00. Any financial assistance you can offer the sisters will be appreciated.

The pastor and parishioners of Our Lady Mediatrix of All Graces Parish take their faith and their church very seriously. It is the center of their small village of Bukulula, Uganda.

The rectory at Our Lady Mediatrix was built in 1927 with no repairs since. Indeed after 83 years many areas of the house need immediate attention.

Your Financial Assistance is needed to help renovate the Rectory at

Our Lady Mediatrix of All Graces Parish in Bukulula, Uganda

Sponsored by Rev Charles Ssekyewa

This rectory is the domicile for three priests and four support staff. Replacing the roof, pulling together cracked walls, replacing windows and doors, installing some indoor plumbing and redoing old electrical wiring are just some of the repairs needed. Fr. Charles stated that "three times this house almost burned down due to old electrical wiring," and recently one of the fathers was required to transfer until something is done to repair the rectory. Their living conditions are very appalling.

At this time the parishioners have finished repairing a temporary shelter while the rectory hopefully will be renovated. It has been a three year struggle to acquire most of the building supplies, but now the biggest challenge is to raise funds to pay skilled and unskilled laborers to do the work.



Below is a cost breakdown:

- Labor: unskilled, one man/week \$17.00USD
- Labor: skilled, one man/week...... \$37.00 USD

- Any amount for materials or labor would be appreciated!

They would like to acquire around \$5000.00 USD before beginning the project and hopefully about \$12-\$13,000 USD would complete the job. All of you who have worked in the electrical, plumbing and construction industries, please add honor to your name and profession by considering a donation to this project to enable the people of Our Lady Mediatrix to begin their renovation. Hopefully, in a year or two they will complete a safe, adequate haven for their clergy and staff.

Assistance Needed to **Purchase Sewing Machines**

Sponsor: Rev. Anthony Boothali Director - PEACE

Pastoral Evangelization and **Children Education (PEACE) was** started in the year 1998 for the purpose of providing education to the poor children in the Chittoor District of India.



PEACE

also undertakes non-formal educational programs for school drop outs, both girls and boys. One non-formal educational program PEACE provides for the girls and women is called SEWING AND TAILORING.

Object of the Program:

The ratio of school drop outs is higher for girls than boys in this area. So the program for Sewing and Tailoring was initiated as a way to help these girls support themselves. The one year training program has room for 50 girls and women. During the course of the program, the girls are taught sewing, netting, embroidery and needlework by a qualified staff.

Benefits: Upon completion of the training program, the girls are provided a sewing machine and tailoring certificate. With this they are able to establish their own sewing shop and make clothes for people to buy. This helps the girls to earn their livelihood and support their families. The sewing center also makes greetings cards and embroidery items like napkins and tablecloths to sell. Some of the girls are employed here.

Assistance Needed: Financial assistance is required to purchase sewing machines and supply to the girls after they complete the training.

The cost of one sewing machine is \$75.00

Fr. Boothali shares: "whatever support that we can receive towards our Sewing and Tailoring program will be greatly appreciated. As a token of our love and appreciation, we pray for you and your family"



Early in his ministry, Comboni Brother Dario Laurencig saw the need for clean water. In order to help make clean water available, Brother Dario learned how to drill deep into the ground to get the needed water. Water is life and many in Kenya do not have access to safe drinking water. A bore hole well can mean the difference between life and death, especially for the very young and the very old.

Funding Request: The people are poor and our missionaries are seeking outside help to fund the approximate \$10,000 needed for a well.

For over 30 years Brother Regis and volunteers of the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse in New Holstein, Wisconsin have been sending pallets of food, vitamins, medicines, clothing, soap and other materials to missions in countries around the world.

Daily, items arrive at the New Holstein warehouse to be shipped around the world to mission villages. Brother Regis along with 290 unpaid volunteers (average age being 75), spend thousands of hours sorting and packing the items for shipment. In 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ years the Salvatorian Warehouse has shipped 1,078 containers totaling 32,272,615 lbs of supplies, costing \$5,294,408.24 for transport.

There are four missionary sisters of the Toledo Province ministering in Papua New Guinea (PNG).

Currently, 16 Papua New Guineans are serving the church as Sisters of Notre Dame in PNG. The Sisters of Notre Dame have been leaders in education since their arrival in PNG in 1961.

Notre Dame Secondary School (NDSS)

- 700 women currently attend NDSS.
- Some young women receive partial scholarships and others participate in a work-study program to earn their way.

• Becoming an educated woman in Papua New Guinea provides these young girls with a sense of their own personal worth in a culture that primarily values men.

Shalom Care Center



A respite center where the sisters help men, women and children infected or affected by the AIDS virus. The sisters have been

leaders in forming a national AIDS awareness education program to prevent and manage the disease.

House of Formation

- For national women who are considering religious life. This is a sign of hope for the life of the church in PNG.
- The young women who feel called to become sisters are also boarders living with the Sisters of Notre Dame. Living expenses and tuition associated women in Initial Formation are high because of their need for advanced education.

Adult learning with year-round courses in Scripture, agricultural studies, cooking, sewing, literacy and health care.




The Augustinians have been serving missions in northern Peru, one of the most impoverished
