Deacon Todd: You know I think I've been a youth minister for right around thirty years.

Narrator: As a deacon, students know they can count on him for guidance as they

make difficult life choices.

Deacon Todd: To lead those kids to help them make a choice that that could really save

their life, that's why I do this.

Narrator: As a missionary of hope, Deacon Todd is grateful he is able to help young

people build life-long relationships with Jesus.

Athena: He just teaches us about Jesus and saints and he's a really great teacher.

Isabella: He is amazing, he's funny and he's just a great guy.

Narrator: Catholic Charities helps families in need of financial health programs, and

other ministries like mental health counseling and adoption services.
