THE VOCATIONS GOAL

As we strive to call forth and form leaders who love Jesus and live His mission, Bishop David Ricken announced a Vocations Goal in the fall of 2019: **By 2025**, we will call forth and form 30 seminarians to be missionary leaders in the priesthood.

Having 30 seminarians would mean that in any given year, we would ordain three to five priests, which is what we believe we will need in order to meet the pastoral needs of our diocese.

There is significant work ahead, as we work to build families and communities of discipleship that discover Jesus, follow Jesus, worship Jesus and share Jesus with others.

"We know this is an ambitious goal, but we believe that if we are going to be the church that God intends us to be, we need to be bold. As Jesus reminds us in the Gospels, the Kingdom of God is like a mustard seed, which starts as the smallest seed but becomes the largest of plants." - **Bishop David Ricken**
