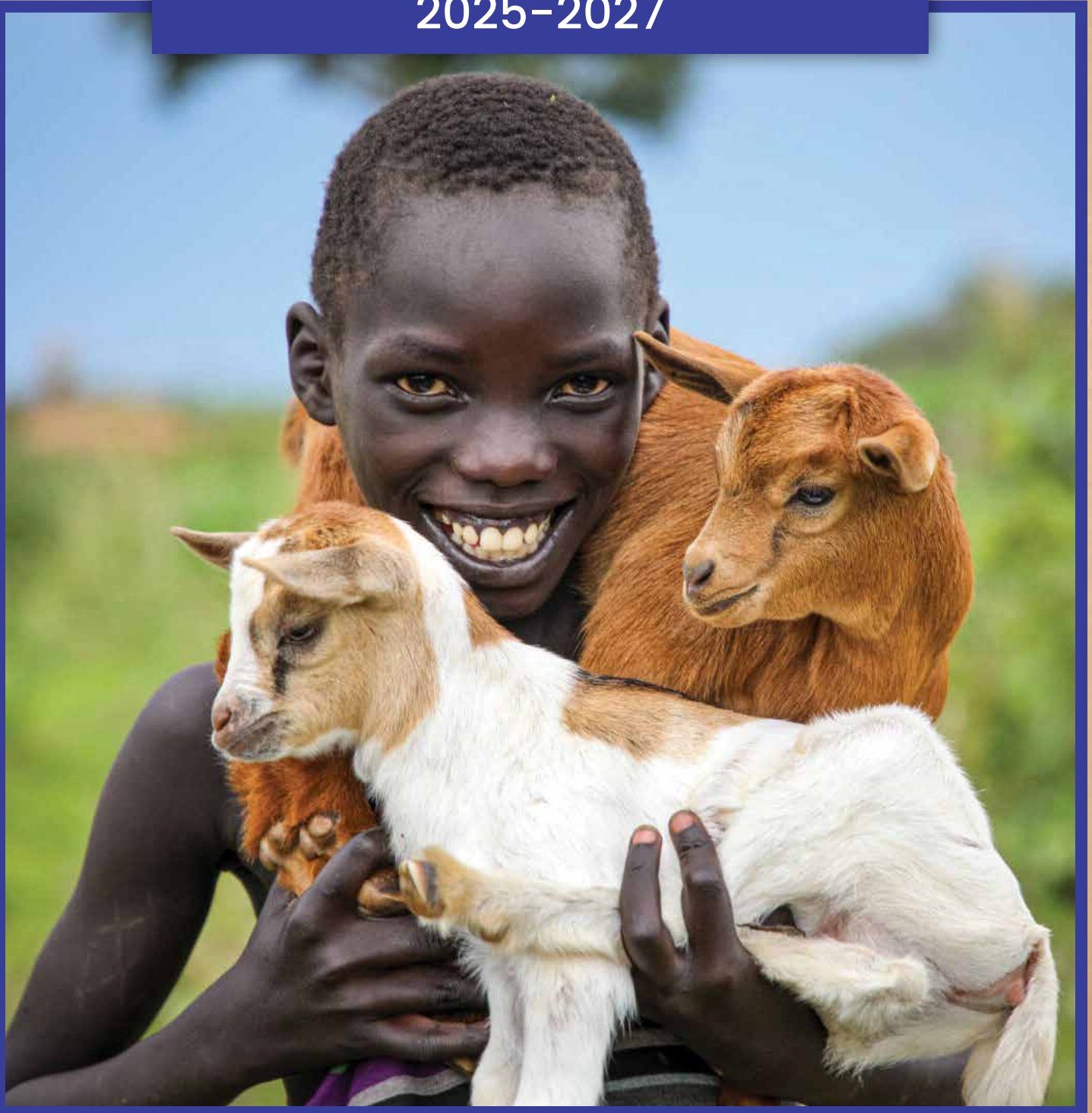

Handmaids of the Divine Redeemer

GHANA



The Handmaids of the Divine Redeemer are a women's religious congregation in Ghana, founded in 1057. Their apostolate is for the moral and Christian education of women and children, paying particular attention to young girl's education. They care for the sick and the aged, provide education, and offer social work.

Ambassador: Sr. Matilda Sorkpor

PROJECT 1: EDUCATION AND HEALTHCARE

Help give holistic education and better access to health care to the orphans under the care of the sisters. This will prepare the children for a successful future and allow them to enjoy good health.

What your gift provides:

\$100 – Medical care for one year

\$150 – Education for a child for one year



PROJECT 2: BUILD A LARGER CHAPEL

A bigger chapel will enable the sisters to hold retreats, profession of vows, and other activities. The current chapel can hold only 35 sisters, which is too small for their growing community.

What your gift provides:

\$100 – 100 bricks



PROJECT 3: WOMEN'S SKILLS TRAINING

The sisters provide skills training like sewing, hair styling, and trading to women. Help them reach out to more of these vulnerable women, so they may become self-reliant and support their families.

What your gift provides:

\$50 – One sewing machine

\$50 – A 3-year apprenticeship fee for one woman

Franciscan Works + Liberia Mission, Inc.

LIBERIA



Franciscan Works and Liberia Mission, Inc. empowers young Liberians to break the cycle of poverty and become faithful adults who can support themselves, their families, and their community.

Ambassador: Dr. Kurt Heyrman

PROJECT 1: BASIC NEEDS FOR ORPHANS

Help sustain the 32 orphans and abandoned children with nutritious food, hygiene products, and quality medicine to combat diseases like typhoid and malaria.

What your gift provides:

\$100 – Basic needs for one orphan for one month



PROJECT 2: CATHOLIC EDUCATION FOR ALL

Many parents cannot afford to send their children to school, and many school-aged girls and boys walk the streets selling goods during school hours. Your assistance will help ensure a child's right to a quality, Catholic education in a country where only 54% of children complete primary school.

What your gift provides:

\$300 – Education for a child for one year



PROJECT 3: SANITARY DINING HALL

Typhoid and H. pylori are both prevalent in Liberia due to unsanitary environments. A clean facility would provide a healthy setting for cooking and eating meals, as well as clean energy from solar panels to power it. The entire cost of the project is \$50,000, but any amount helps.

What your gift provides:

- \$100 – Eleven bags of cement
- \$200 – One bundle of tin for the roof
- \$400 – One dining room table and two benches
- \$500 – One solar panel
- \$2,500 – One KW solar power kit (solar panel, inverter, charger, battery, and wires)
- \$7,500 – Security fence with gate



Beyond The Camp

RWANDA + UGANDA



Beyond The Camp (formally Burundi Education Fund) supports families and children in Nakivale (Uganda) and Mahama (Rwanda) Refugee Camps.

Ambassador: Egide Nimubona

PROJECT 1: EVANGELIZATION THROUGH BASIC LITERACY

A lack of classrooms, limited number of qualified teachers, and increased hunger prevent access to basic literacy education in the Nakivale Refugee Camp. Additionally, with only one Catholic parish in a camp of 150,000 people, families have a lack of access to the Sacraments and Masses. This has led to many Catholics losing their faith and being unable to introduce the Catholic faith to their children. Beyond The Camp seeks to bring the Catholic faith and a light of hope to refugee children through education and healing.

What your gift provides:

- \$40 – One uniform
- \$60 – A bench for 2-3 children
- \$400 – Monthly wage for a teacher (average)
- \$10,000 – Builds a classroom



PROJECT 2: SUSTAINING EDUCATION THROUGH FARMING

One of the major problems facing children trying to receive education is hunger. Beyond The Camp is working to improve the nutritional situation for refugee children attending the only Catholic school in the Nakivale Refugee Camp. Families work the land and split the harvest, with 50% brought home to feed their families and 50% left on the site to feed the children attending school.

Your support will also help families raise chickens, goats, and pigs to provide much needed protein. For the first time ever, children will have access to eggs and meat in their diet.

What your gift provides:

- \$2 – Fruit trees
- \$3 – One chicken for eggs
- \$5 – Bean seeds to cover 0.5 acres per family
- \$21 – One pig
- \$54 – One goat



Living Waters International, Inc.

TANZANIA



The mission of **Living Waters International, Inc.** is to procure funds for the support of Roman Catholic missionary and international development projects in Africa and India. This mission arises from faith in Jesus Christ, His desire to share the Gospel with all people, and His call to each of us to do our part to alleviate human suffering among the poor and marginalized of this world.

Ambassador: Eileen Hartl

PROJECT 1: PRIMARY SCHOOL CLASSROOMS

In Masai culture, the education of girls is typically not given high priority, and girls are often forced into early marriages. This permanently closes the door to educational opportunities and hinders their progress in life.

Some girls are allowed to further their education, but if they attend a Swahili primary school, they find they are at a disadvantage when transitioning to English secondary schools. To facilitate the education of Masai girls, Living Waters would like to construct classrooms for an English primary school in Tanzania.

What your gift provides:

\$200 – Window

\$450 – Door

\$3,000 – Beams and columns for walls

PROJECT 2: SUGARCANE INITIATIVE

Parishioners of the Ibumbida Missions in the Singida Diocese of Tanzania have been busy cultivating sugarcane to help less fortunate families send their children to school. Aside from tuition fees, the money also provides food, boarding, school supplies, and health insurance to cover malarial attacks.

One acre of sugarcane can yield a minimum of 29 tons and a maximum of 40 tons. For the children, it will yield a lifetime of knowledge that can reduce poverty, improve health, increase income, and foster peace.

What your gift provides:

\$11 – 100 sugarcane seed plants

\$500 – Preparation of one acre



Missionary Sisters of the Precious Blood

TANZANIA



Missionary Sisters of the Precious Blood are an international congregation of women, founded by the Trappist Abbot Francis Pfanner in Mariannhill, South Africa, in 1885. Their title is their mandate: to live the Paschal Mystery and to be witnesses to the redeeming love of Christ.

Ambassador: Sr. Eusebia Urassa

PROJECT 1: TUITION FOR STUDENTS

Machui Kindergarten opened in 1989 with the goal of providing education to children from poor families making a living from small scale farming and local business. There are about 60 children attending, and they are eager to learn. Many more parents wish to bring their children to the school, but they cannot afford the tuition.

What your gift provides:

\$120 – Porridge for a child for one year

\$192 – Tuition for a child for one year



PROJECT 2: ST. LUKE'S DISPENSARY

The dispensary has an average of 2,900 to 3,000 patients per month. It receives no support from the government, which sometimes makes it difficult to provide efficient care. One of the greatest needs is an ultrasound machine which could help with early detection of many medical issues.

What your gift provides:

\$19,000 – Ultrasound machine



PROJECT 3: MACHUI COMMUNITY CENTER

Machui Youth Community Training Center (MYCTC) is a vocational training center for youth which aims to train dropouts, those who cannot afford to go to secondary school, and those who did not do well in school. MYCTC helps them acquire life skills and knowledge that leads to employment. As the center serves all people without discrimination, it has been able to uplift the lives of the marginalized.

What your gift provides:

\$100 – Lunches for one month

\$240 – Practical materials for one year

\$560 – Tuition fee for one year

Diocese of Kasana-Luweero

UGANDA



The **Diocese of Kasana-Luweero** is the youngest diocese in Uganda, established in 1997. About one-third of the diocese is occupied by semi-nomadic people who move from place to place in search of food for their animals. The diocese has slightly over seventy diocesan priests running twenty-one parishes. It also has a few religious missionaries, in addition to religious sisters and brothers. The diocese has about forty seminarians.

Ambassador: Fr. Celestine Byekwaso

PROJECT 1: BUILD A RECTORY

Parishes are quite far from one another and people must go a long distance to attend Mass. In these areas, the diocese would like to build a rectory for a priest to live in while he works with the local people to build a church. The goal is to have a priests' presence in the area to help people receive the Sacraments more often. The rectory will be built in phases depending on the availability of the funds.

What your gift provides:

\$100 – Twelve bags of cement

\$200 – Fifty 6x2 timbers



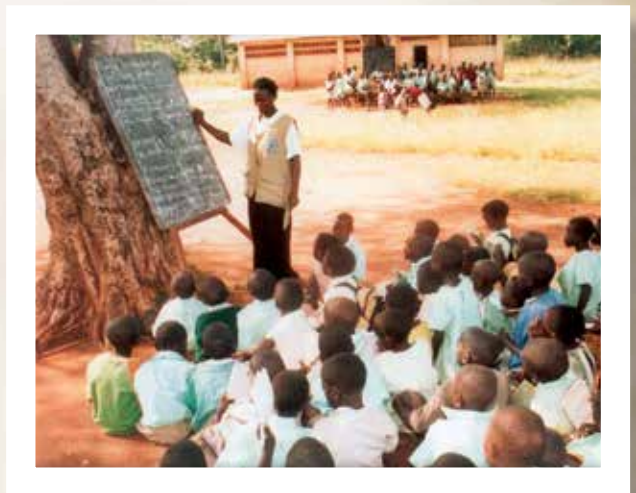
PROJECT 2: BUILD A SCHOOL

There is need for more Catholic schools in the diocese. Without a classroom, students study under trees. This means the children cannot attend classes during the rainy season, which disrupts their education.

What your gift provides:

\$50 – Thirty cement blocks

\$100 – Four iron sheets for roofing



PROJECT 3: GET WATER TO OUR SCHOOLS

Unlike the schools in the U.S., most of the schools in the Diocese of Kasana-Luweero have no running water. Some even have no drinking water near the compound. A survey uncovered water below the compound, which will cost each school \$10,000 to access.

What your gift provides:

Contributions in any amount are greatly appreciated.



Little Sisters of St. Francis

UGANDA



The Little Sisters of St. Francis educate and board girls ages 6–18 at Stella Maris boarding school in Nsuube, Uganda. All girls are accepted regardless of religion or whether tuition can be paid. There are approximately 1,000 girls in the residence, and schooling is year-round.

Ambassador: Pat DeGroot

PROJECT 1: NEW DORMITORIES

Boarding schools are common in Uganda because of the poverty in the country. Unfortunately, one of the dorms at Stella Maris burned down, and another was damaged by a severe thunderstorm. Both are uninhabitable, and the girls have doubled up in other dorm spaces. The sisters would like to rebuild and renovate the two dorms, so the students can have adequate space.

What your gift provides:

- \$9 – Bag of cement
- \$10 – 10 bricks
- \$37 – Plaster sand



PROJECT 2: FARM LIVESTOCK

While boarding, the girls are fed rice, beans, and millet. On occasion, they will have meat from the chickens raised on the premises. Learning agricultural skills is also important for the girls, since they are living in a rural area.

What your gift provides:

- \$15 – Two chickens
- \$25 – One piglet
- \$75 – One cow



Servants of Mary the Queen

ZIMBABWE



The **Servants of Mary the Queen (AMR)** are a congregation of religious women formed in 1956 in Bulawayo, Zimbabwe. The sisters work to remove barriers to education, such as poverty and early marriage, so children can gain knowledge and skills that will positively impact their communities.

Ambassador: Sr. Martha Mafurutu

PROJECT 1: BUILD A RETIREMENT CONVENT

The congregation has some aging members, and they would like to construct a home suitable for spiritual nourishment, physical exercise, and recreation.

Currently, the elderly sisters are staying in the same convents as those who are still active in the ministry, and as a result, they are not getting the attention they deserve and require. They are also far from medical facilities that meet their needs.

What your gift provides:

\$1 – Industry brick

\$13 – One bag of cement

PROJECT 2: BOREWELL

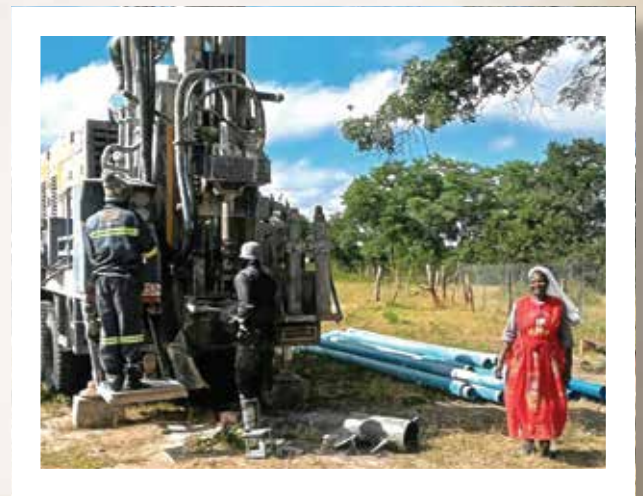
Water will be a big challenge for the new retirement home, yet a necessity. For the smooth running of such a home, there is a need for a borehole that will supply running water to the home and vegetable garden.

What your gift provides:

\$12 – Pit sand (used for plastering)

\$13 – One bag of cement

\$20 – 45 x 230 brick force



Diocese of Kurnool Society

INDIA



The Diocese of Kurnool Society was established in 1967. It covers the civil districts of Kurnool, Ananthapur, Nanyal, and Puttaparthi, four of the poorest and most populated districts of Rayalaseema region. There are about 65 parishes with many substations (hamlets).

Ambassador: Fr. Francis Nusi

PROJECT 1: DRILLING BOREWELLS

The Rayalaseema region is a chronically drought-affected region where people walk miles to collect drinking water. The Society would like to drill borewells to help people secure adequate drinking water.

What your gift provides:

\$1,000 – Drilling of one borewell

\$2,000 – Installing one motor with accessories

PROJECT 2: FAITH FORMATION PROGRAM

Faith formation coordinators will play a pivotal role in deepening faith, fostering unity, promoting service, and coordinating community outreach activities.

What your gift provides:

\$200 – Travel costs per month

\$600 – Program costs per month



PROJECT 3: RENOVATION OF BISHOP'S HOUSE

The Bishop's house serves as both a residence and an administrative center for the Diocese of Kurnool. Over the years, it has experienced significant deterioration. The roof has developed severe leaks, causing water damage to the interior, and the walls are showing signs of structural stress. The project aims to maintain the Bishop's House as a functional and safe place to serve the spiritual and administrative needs of the community effectively.

What your gift provides:

\$600 – Painting and finishing

\$1,200 – Electrical and plumbing

\$1,200 – Renovation of chapel interior

\$1,800 – Renovation of meeting rooms and offices

\$2,400 – Structural repairs

\$3,500 – Roof repair and waterproofing



Diocese of Sivagangai

INDIA



The **Diocese of Sivagangai** is in the southern part of India, very close to Sri Lanka. It has a population of Catholics who are strong in their faith. Most people are farmers and fishermen. The region is dry, however, and reliant on monsoons. Many improvements are needed in the lives of the people in the Diocese.

Ambassador: Fr. Xavier Santiago

PROJECT 1: SAFE WATER AND SANITATION

The diocese aims to provide safe water and sanitation to the communities within the Diocese of Sivagangai. Their focus is on safeguarding the health of young children. Since 2015, they have helped seven communities receive clean drinking water through the building of wells and improving sanitation in the local schools.

What your gift provides:

\$1,000 – Well

PROJECT 2: POWER GENERATION

The schools and churches in the interior parts of the Diocese are challenged by frequent and prolonged power supply cuts. Your generous assistance would set up generators, so they would have a continuous power supply. This would ease the concerns for basic survival and provide opportunities for improved learning and devotional services.

What your gift provides:

\$500 – Generator

\$700 – Motor

PROJECT 3: SCHOOL TECHNOLOGY

The Diocese of Sivagangai wishes to equip high schools with modern computers. Today's schools are technology driven. Nowadays, a computer is a necessity – not a luxury. Sadly, many rural schools do not yet have modern computer equipment. We aim to equip the high schools with the advanced technology needed to provide an excellent student-centered education.

What your gift provides:

\$100 – One tablet for a class to share

\$250 – One computer for one class



Diocese of Warangal

INDIA



The Diocese of Warangal is a mission diocese, established in 1952. More than 75% of the population lives in rural areas. Around 68% of the total population is below the poverty line with most people working in daily wage-earning occupations like agrarian labor and other forms of casual labor. At present, there are 75,000 Catholics, 97 diocesan priests, 80 religious priests, 630 nuns, and 300 catechists in six mission stations.

Ambassador: Fr. Anil Polumari

PROJECT 1: SOLAR PANELS FOR HOSPITAL

Installing solar panels at Medicare General Hospital of Warangal Diocese would provide uninterrupted energy during surgeries to protect the lives of the patients. Medicare General Hospital provides healthcare for around 500 poor and marginalized people per day. This hospital serves all people regardless of their social status or religious background. Serving the sick and suffering is the main motto of the hospital. Medical devices require electricity, but with frequent interruptions, the lives of patients are at stake.

What your gift provides:

- \$250 – Battery
- \$500 – Electrical wire
- \$1,000 – Solar panel
- \$5,000 – Labor expenses for installation



PROJECT 2: SKILL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

Skills development is needed for overcoming skill gaps. Skill development training focuses on skills that are essential to make the youth more productive and employable. It will allow an individual to learn, grow, and contribute to the economy of the country. The most basic and key initiatives would be agriculture-related training and development; computer and digital training; microfinance for entrepreneurs; and frontline-healthcare education.

What your gift provides:

- \$350 – Digital board and equipment
- \$500 – One computer (need 10 computers)
- \$1,500 – Tutoring expenses



Holy Spirit Sisters

INDIA



The **Holy Spirit Sisters Congregation** was founded by Father Bernard Bendel in Germany. In 2002, the congregation was invited by the Diocese of Kurnool to take up pastoral and social activities in the parish of Our Lady of Lourdes, which includes five mission stations.

Ambassador: Fr. Francis Nusi

PROJECT 1: BUILDING RENOVATION

The sisters would like to create a more ideal space to form the faith of the 300 children attending faith formation programs. This would involve repairing an old building and creating classrooms for the different groups of children.

What your gift provides:

\$60 – Bathroom sink

\$360 – Sand and gravel

\$500 – 100 bags of cement



PROJECT 2: SOLAR LIGHTING AND HOT WATER

Due to frequent power cuts, Holy Spirit Old Age Home needs solar lighting and a hot water system. In India, solar power has been successful due to the large amount of sunlight. By utilizing solar energy, they can save on monthly electrical bills while ensuring the elderly in their care always have light and hot water available.

What your gift provides:

\$500 – Wiring and pipes

\$850 – 500-liter tank

\$1,500 – 10 Solar panels



PROJECT 3: HOSTEL MAINTENANCE

Students in rural villages have no bus transportation to school, so a hostel was built at Holy Spirit School. There are currently 50 Catholic students living in the hostel, and the cost of food and toiletries for these children can become quite costly.

What your gift provides:

\$60 – Milk for one month

\$100 – Toiletries for one month

\$150 – Groceries for one month



Hyderabad Archdiocese

INDIA



The Hyderabad Archdiocese Social Service Society (HASSS) is the official entity of the Catholic Archdiocese of Hyderabad, dedicated to social and economic development. Since its inception in 1973, HASSS has been tirelessly working toward uplifting the vulnerable poor in the Archdiocese.

HASSS engages in 210 rural villages, prioritizing women-centric programs and promoting food security among farmers, children's education, and health initiatives. It operates based on the principles of ownership, sustainability, and collective progress.

Ambassador: Fr. Louis Golamari

PROJECT 1: EDUCATION OF POOR AND VULNERABLE CHILDREN

HASSS has observed a concerning trend where families with meager financial means prioritize basic needs over education for their children, leading to a cycle of poverty and vulnerability. This exposes children to risks like child marriages, child labor, and substance abuse. Recognizing the urgent need to intervene, HASSS has launched this project to identify and support poor families who struggle to send their children to school. They aim to enroll 700 deserving children from 130 parishes in formal or non-formal schooling.

What your gift provides:

\$10 – Backpack for one child

\$210 – Tuition assistance for one child

PROJECT 2: WOMEN'S SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Recognizing the challenges faced by single women, HASSS seeks to improve the earning capacity of these women through skills training. By providing training in sewing and beautician services, the project intends to equip women with the necessary skills to secure higher-paying jobs, improve their livelihoods, and support their families.

What your gift provides:

\$107 – Automatic sewing machine

\$119 – Beautician skills training for one woman

\$144 – Beautician start-up kits

\$167 – Sewing skills training for one woman



Society for Faith and Children's Education

INDIA



The Society for Faith and Children's Education (SFACE)

evangelizes through education. They provide post-secondary education for the youth in India because they believe education is the key to success. They also believe the love of Jesus Christ empowers youth to overcome poverty, so they may live a more dignified life while fulfilling their role within the local communities.

Ambassador: June Ingold

PROJECT: DORMITORIES FOR THE MISSION CENTER

SFACE needs a dorm for the students visiting the campus for meetings. Currently, SFACE Mission Center has no dorm for them to stay in. They are looking to build a 1,450 square feet (25 ft x 58 ft) dorm. The total estimated cost is \$43,500, but gifts in any amount can help them get closer to their goal.

What your gift provides:

- \$12 – Bricks (100)
- \$30 – Cost per square foot
- \$50 – Ten cement bags
- \$50 – Sand
- \$80 – Concrete
- \$600 – Steel (1 ton)



Missionaries of Faith

MYANMAR + SAMOA + VIETNAM



Missionaries of Faith are a congregation who in their very name bear their apostolic work: Faith & Mission. They help priests who are in need, particularly spiritually and psychologically. They help financially poor young men, aspiring to become priests, fulfill their dreams. They have seminarians from multiple countries studying in the Philippines.

PROJECT: BE PART OF A PRIEST'S JOURNEY

Others joined the General House formation program due to lack of resources in their own country, like Samoa and Vietnam, for their seminary schooling and religious missionary formation.

The goals of the project are to finance their yearly seminary tuition and religious missionary formation demands.

Brothers of the Sacred Heart

PHILIPPINES



Brothers of the Sacred Heart, US Province, financially assists schools in six African countries (Kenya, Uganda, Lesotho, Zambia, Zimbabwe, and Mozambique) and a school in the Philippines. The program in the Philippines focuses on caring for homeless children. They house, educate, and teach these young children a trade so that upon leaving, they are prepared to begin a new life with a fresh start.

PROJECT: BASIC NEEDS FOR ORPHANS

Through IconHope and Project M.O.S.E.S, the Brothers of the Sacred Heart provides food, shelter, and education to homeless children on the island of Cebu in the Philippines. In four months, 6,000 packed meals and fresh fruit juice were served to 300 children. The educational component of the program provides school fees, books, clothing, and school supplies, so children can continue their education.

IconHome is a permanent residential facility providing housing for abandoned young people in Cebu. It currently houses more than twenty teenagers, providing permanent support, education, and daily contact with positive, Christian role models.

The project also offers younger children and teenagers opportunities to attend workshops and camps which cover spiritual and moral formation, health and hygiene, family formation, and child protection issues – all with the goal of helping each of them see themselves as a unique child of God. These efforts will help these children become positive contributors to the Church and society.

It is costly to provide a quality Catholic education for these children, so the Brothers need support to continue their work. Help them reach out to more of these children in need of hope and a home.

What your gift provides:

- \$80 – Food for one child for one year
- \$100 – Participation in camp programs for one child
- \$150 – Participation in a two-month program for one older child (Includes room and board, educational materials, etc.)
- \$200 – Education for one child for one year



Community of Saint Paul

BOLIVIA + COLOMBIA



The Community of Saint Paul is an international missionary group currently responsible for various missions in Bolivia, the Dominican Republic, Mexico, Colombia, and Ethiopia. Wherever they are present, the members of the Community of Saint Paul strive to promote the integral development of all, so the people they serve can discover their full human potential and dignity.

PROJECT 1: RETURNING BOYS TO FAMILIES

Almost 2,000 children living on the streets of Cochabamba, Bolivia, have run away from home due to extreme poverty, dysfunctional families, parental alcoholism, domestic violence, abuse, and mistreatment. Founded in 2004, Casa San José works to keep boys and youth off the streets before they get trapped in gangs, drug use, and human trafficking. At the Center, they receive food, medical care, education, psychological counseling, and training in self-care. Meanwhile, professionals search for family and strive to work with them to address issues, so the boys can return home or to another family member.

What your gift provides:

- \$60 – Support for one child for one month
- \$720 – Support for one child for one year



PROJECT 2: COMMUNITY CENTER

Started in 2015 in La Resurrección Parish, the Casa Garabito Center aims to address the needs of at-risk populations within the parish area. Most of the population would be classified as the “working poor.” Services include school tutoring and other classes for children, a scholarship program for university students, literacy classes for the elderly, a sewing center, outreach to immigrant families from Venezuela, and counseling services. Other classes, apart from being enriching (such as guitar and English), plant seeds of interest for activities that keep youth off the street and prevent drug use.

What your gift provides:

- \$30 – Food package for a family of four
- \$40 – Three initial sessions of counseling services
- \$100 – Rent for a Venezuelan family looking for work
- \$300 – Aid for one semester for a university student (books and transportation)



Dominican Republic Mission

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC



The Dominican Republic Mission has been supported by the Diocese of Green Bay since 1963. The Mission provides support to a very impoverished area along the border of the Dominican Republic and Haiti.

The Diocese of San Juan de La Maguana, in which Father Mike serves, has half a million Catholics. He is currently the vicar general, chancellor, and head of Catholic Charities for the Diocese. Father Mike ministers to more than 35,000 people in his parish, made up of 50 communities. He also oversees the education of 1,300 students in a K-12 Catholic school.

PROJECT 1: HOUSE REPAIRS

Many homes in Elías Piña, Dominican Republic, need repair. Most repairs consist of replacing the corrugated tin on roofs and cementing the floors. The parish provides the materials while families and individuals do the repair work.

What your gift provides:

\$7 – One bag of cement

\$8 – One sheet of tin

PROJECT 2: LATRINE PROJECT

One of this community's essential needs is basic sanitation. A latrine is a very practical solution to help with sanitation needs and control infectious diseases.

What your gift provides:

\$250 – Fully built latrine

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC + HAITI



Sr. Maria Marciano began her work in the Dominican Republic in 1992 and Haiti in 2011. The focus of Sr. Maria's work is educating the people on sustainable environmental and agricultural practices. She has helped build several aqueduct systems to provide clean drinking water, more than 40 miles of road allowing access to schools, and numerous community centers. Through hard work, families can benefit from increased salaries and bountiful harvests of food.

PROJECT 1: WATER SOURCES FOR FARMING

Water and other natural resources in Haiti and the Dominican Republic are diminishing after years of cutting down trees and burning up land to make charcoal. Sr. Maria is working to educate the people on the importance of protecting their fertile soil through reforestation and using modern irrigation practices, including water reservoirs and solar water pumps.

What your gift provides:

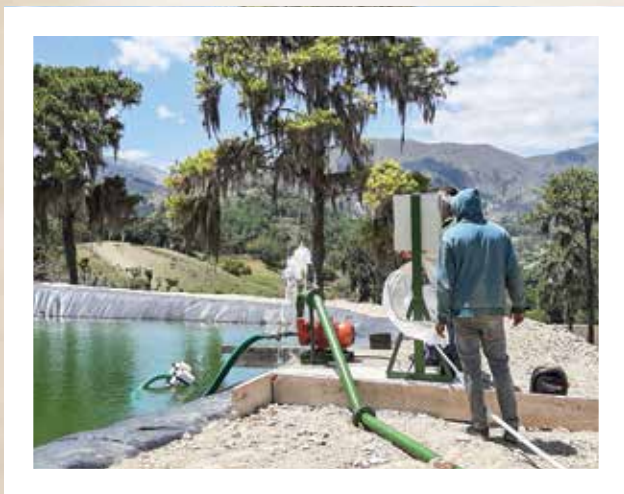
- \$20 – Each length of pipe for irrigation
- \$600 – Solar-powered water pump

PROJECT 2: AGRICULTURE SUPPLIES

With the work that has already been done to set up reservoirs and irrigation, Sr. Maria and her team have been able to help 15 families begin producing various crops such as tomatoes, lettuce, corn, and peppers. This has allowed these families to have an improved quality of life, both financially and nutritionally. Through mentorship, these communities are making lasting change.

What your gift provides:

- \$25 – Trays of 25 seedlings
- \$40 – One bag of fertilizer



Missionary Fraternity of Mary, Ltd.

GUATEMALA



The **Missionary Fraternity of Mary** is the first Catholic missionary community founded in Guatemala to promote, form, and educate young men to become missionary priests. Presently, the Fraternity serves and brings the Good News of Jesus Christ in thirteen countries. Those countries are: Ecuador, Panamá, Venezuela, Perú, Belize, Guatemala, Honduras, México, Cuba, Italy, Kenya, Canada, and the United States.

PROJECT 1: SUPPORT SEMINARIANS

There are 55 seminarians in formation in Guatemala City. The challenge is these seminarians come from poor families in Guatemala and cannot afford to pay tuition. Through your support, you offer hope for a more meaningful life for the young missionary priests and the people they serve.

What your gift provides:

- \$100 – Learning materials for a seminarian for one year
- \$250 – Room, board, and tuition for a seminarian for one month
- \$300 – Medical attention for a seminarian for one year

PROJECT 2: CHICKEN FARM

A chicken farm was built through the support of donors. The chicken farm helps the seminary defray costs in their annual budget. Presently, they have 200 hens. Every eight months, the hens must be replaced as egg production diminishes.

What your gift provides:

- \$400 – 200 hens (needed every 8 months)

PROJECT 3: GREENHOUSES

Through the generosity of others, the seminary was able to build two greenhouses which help support their dietary needs. They continue to need seeds and plant materials annually for the greenhouses and gardens.

What your gift provides:

- \$75 – Vegetable seeds (tomato, cabbage, carrots, lettuce, radish, onions, peppers)



Hands and Hearts with Haiti

HAITI



Hands and Hearts with Haiti is a united, multi-parish partnership rooted in mutual trust and respect. They seek beneficial self-sustainable opportunities to best meet the needs of those in Mirabalais, Haiti. They believe education is key and have the goal of creating and supporting programs that assist families economically and lead to self-sufficiency.

PROJECT: EDUCATING BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

Hands and Hearts with Haiti aims to make a long-term generational difference in Haiti by supporting the educational and economic development of the youth both inside and outside of the classroom. This is achieved by providing books and hands-on learning about goat farming.

With their newfound skills, farmers have been able to purchase other livestock, pay medical bills, afford tuition, buy food, and create savings.

This has allowed them to become more self-sufficient and have pride in their work.

What your gift provides:

\$10 – Lunch for a student for one week

\$50 – Tuition assistance for one year

\$100 – One female goat for breeding

\$500 – One stud goat for breeding (that the entire community will share)



Salvatorian Mission Warehouse

WORLDWIDE



The Salvatorian Mission Warehouse is a project supported by the Society of the Divine Savior that works to gather donated relief goods, repackage them to meet the standards of shipping, load them into shipping containers, and send the relief goods to various missions around the world.

PROJECT 1: CHANGING THE WORLD ONE CONTAINER AT A TIME

The Salvatorian Mission Warehouse sends an average of two containers per month to mission partners. The containers are filled with essentials such as food, clothing, tools, medical supplies, and other various necessities. Once emptied, these containers are used for houses, schools, community centers, and more. With the support of generous donors and volunteers, the Salvatorian Mission Warehouse is dedicated to changing the world, one container at a time.

What your gift provides:

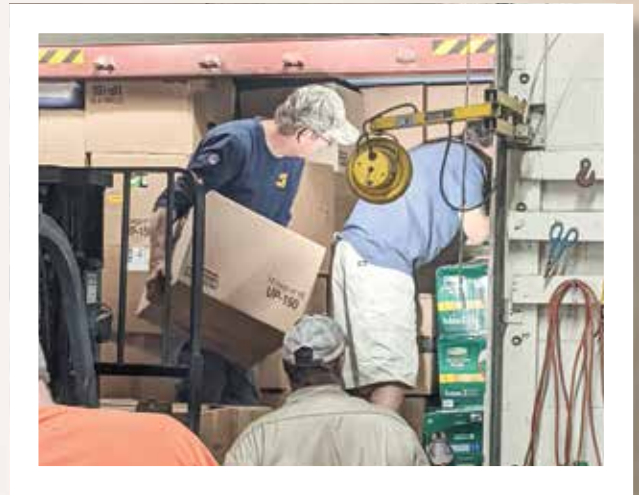
- \$30 – Eight female hygiene kits
