Please take the following simple steps to promote the World's Poor collection in your parish:

- <u>Announce</u> the Home Missions collection in your parish. Please inform your parishioners what the collection is, when to expect it, and why they should support it.
- <u>Share</u> bulletin announcements, intercessions, and collection envelopes with your parishioners.
- <u>Pray</u> and encourage parishioners to make a difference by offering their prayers and generous gifts for a fruitful collection to bring faith, hope, and charity for all peoples to know Jesus Christ in our communities.

The Home Missions – Our Own Needs Collection supports the following Catholic agencies:

- <u>Black and Indian Mission</u> Exists to build Christian communities among the Native American, African American, and Alaskan Native people. Every penny collected is distributed as diocesan grants to support and strengthen evangelization programs in the United States. Annually, in our Diocese, we receive grants to assist our parishes in Neopit and Keshena with outreach, education, and service to the people of the Menominee Indian Tribe.
- <u>The Catholic Communications Campaign (CCC)</u> Modernizes how the Church communicates the joy of the Gospel nationwide and locally. Half of all funds collected for the CCC remain in our diocese to support local communication efforts. This collection connects people to the Gospel.
- <u>The Catholic University of America</u> The National University of the Catholic Church. Your gift enables the University to prepare the next generation of Catholic leadership, both religious and lay. Every donated dollar supports scholarships to assist financially deserving students in completing their education.
- <u>The Catholic Home Missions</u> Assists 40% of dioceses in the United States. Poverty, distance, difficult terrain, and lack of priests significantly affects the ability of mission dioceses to offer basic pastoral needs. Home Missions provides financial assistance for Mass, sacraments, and faith formation.

Bulletin Announcements:

One week before collection (May 31st and June 1st)

Next week, we will take up the Home Missions – Our Own Needs collection, which supports the Black and Indian Missions, Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC), Catholic University of America, and Catholic Home Missions dioceses. This consolidated
